## **General Instruction to Candidates**

1. Application form for admission to D.I.P. & D.N.T. Courses for the Academic Year 2023-2024 in Government School of AYUSH Paramedical Courses can be downloaded / accessed from the following official website: [www.tnhealth.tn.gov.in](http://www.tnhealth.tn.gov.in).
2. Candidates should submit the filled in application form, downloaded from the website, with all the required supporting documents, along with the details of payment of Rs. 350/- (Rupees three hundred and fifty only) towards the application cost i.e., with SBI collect transaction ID (copy of receipt to be enclosed).

**Note: Scheduled Caste / Scheduled Caste (Arunthathiyar) / Scheduled Tribe Candidates of Tamil Nadu native are exempted from the remittance of the cost of the application.**

3. Read all the instructions carefully before filling up the application form.

4. The Selection Committee will not in any way be responsible for the delay in receipt or loss in transit of application form or any other ground beyond the specified date and time. Applications of the candidates received after the last date and time will not be accepted irrespective of the date of booking.
5. Request for extension of time for submission of application form along with all the required supporting documents called for after the specified date and time will not be entertained.
6. Application form of the candidates along with all the relevant documents received after the due date of submission of the application form or application form of the candidates received without required supporting documents / particulars will be summarily rejected.
7. Candidates applying under Special Category should also fill up the General application form only. No separate application form for Special Categories.

**Note: Counselling for Special Category will be conducted first followed by General Category**

8. Special Category rank differs completely from that of the General Category rank. Special Category candidates cannot claim the same rank in the General Category and vice-versa.
9. The candidates are instructed to visit the official website [www.tnhealth.tn.gov.in](http://www.tnhealth.tn.gov.in) at least twice a day for updates from the date of issue of application till the end of admission process without fail. Selection Committee will not be responsible for consequences resulting due to non-diligent follow up of notices, notification and publications appearing on the website regarding admission to Diploma

courses for the Academic Year 2023-2024.

10. General Merit List and the Counselling schedule will be uploaded in the official website, viz., [www.tnhealth.tn.gov.in](http://www.tnhealth.tn.gov.in). The Application Registration Number (A.R. No.) will appear in the General Merit List.

3.		<p><b>Age Limit:</b></p> <p>All the candidates should have completed the age of <b>17 years</b> on or before 31<sup>st</sup> December 2023 and the maximum age limit is <b>35 years</b>; for Scheduled Caste / Scheduled Caste (Arunthathiyars) / Scheduled Tribes and <b>30 years for Other Communities.</b></p>

**4. Qualification criteria:**

- 4.1. Candidates should have passed in all the subjects of Higher Secondary Course. i.e., 10+2.
- 4.2. Examination conducted by the Tamil Nadu State Board or the Senior Secondary School Examination under CBSE Pattern or equivalent examination with the following group of subjects.
  - a) Maths, Physics, Chemistry and Biology; (or)
  - b) Physics, Chemistry, Botany and Zoology; (or)
  - c) Physics, Chemistry, Biology with any other subject.

**Note:** 4. a. Candidates who have passed in vocational stream, is not eligible to apply. Candidates who have passed in National Institute of Open Schooling (NIOS) and private candidates are eligible to apply for the above courses.

- 4.3. Minimum Eligibility Marks:
  - i. For OC:  
Minimum of 45% marks in aggregate in the Science subjects namely Physics, Chemistry and Biology or Botany and Zoology.
  - ii. For BC, BCM, MBC / DNC:  
Minimum of 40% marks in aggregate in the Science subjects namely Physics, Chemistry and Biology or Botany and Zoology.
  - iii. For SC / SCA / ST:  
Minimum of 35% marks in aggregate in the Science subjects namely Physics, Chemistry and Biology or Botany and Zoology.

**5. Medium of Instruction:**

English shall be the Medium of Instruction for all the subjects of study and for examinations to the said Courses.

**6. Duration of the Course:**

The duration of study for both the courses shall be 2½ years including six months of Non-Stipendiary Compulsory Rotatory Internship training at various hospitals of this Department.

Note: 6.a. The students shall have to make their own arrangements for stay and travel during the period of study and training. The intention of conducting these courses is to technically train the candidates to professionally function as Integrated Pharmacist and Nursing Therapist. The Government does not assure any employment to the holder.

7. **Curriculum:**

The Curriculum and the Syllabi for the courses shall be prescribed by the Governing Council for AYUSH Paramedical Courses of this department from time to time.

8. **List of Government Schools of AYUSH Paramedical Courses:**

The courses will be conducted at the following two Government Schools:

Note 8.a. No Hostel facility is provided for the students enrolling in the Diploma courses.



9. **Seat Matrix:**
- 9.1. For Diploma in Integrated Pharmacy (D.I.P.) Course: 50 seats in each of the Government Schools of AYUSH Paramedical Courses, out of which 25 seats will be reserved for men and 25 seats will be reserved for women. If male candidates are not available then the seats reserved for men will be filled up with female candidates and vice versa.
- 9.2. For Diploma in Nursing Therapy (D.N.T.) Course: 50 seats in each of the Government Schools of AYUSH Paramedical Courses, out of which 25 seats will be reserved for men and 25 seats will be reserved for women. If male candidates are not available then the seats reserved for men will be filled up with female candidates and vice versa.
10. **Tuition Fees:**
- 10.1. For Diploma in Integrated Pharmacy (D.I.P.) Course: Rs. 3,600/- (Rupees Three thousand six hundred only) per annum.
- 10.2. For Diploma in Nursing Therapy (D.N.T) Course: Rs. 7,200/- (Rupees Seven thousand two hundred only) per annum.
- 10.2a. The fee mentioned above should be paid at the time of receipt of allotment order during Counseling for the first year of course.
- 10.2b. The fee mentioned above is subject to modification as per rules in force.
- 10.3 Fees once paid will not be refunded under any circumstances. Candidates discontinuing the course cannot claim for refund of tuition fees paid. The transfer certificate and conduct certificate will be issued to discontinued candidates by the Head of Institutes concerned, on receipt of declaration from student and parent that they will not request for rejoining the course or for the refund of fees paid.

11. **Method of Selection and Admission:**

Selection will be made on merit based on the marks obtained by the eligible candidates in the science subjects in the qualifying examinations calculated to the base of 200 marks. The method of calculation is given below:

**Weighted total marks for maximum of :200**

Percentage in Biology	(A)
Percentage in Physics and Chemistry taken together	(B)
Percentage in Botany and Zoology taken together	(C)
Weighted total marks for a maximum of 200	Either (A+B) or (B+C)

12. **Rank List:**

12.1. Merit list will be prepared among all eligible candidates and will be published at the office of the Secretary, Selection Committee, Directorate of Indian Medicine & Homoeopathy, Arignar Anna Government Hospital of Indian Medicine Campus, Arumbakkam, Chennai – 600 106 and the Merit list will also be uploaded in the official website – [www.tnhealth.tn.gov.in](http://www.tnhealth.tn.gov.in).

12.2. **Determination of Rank of candidates obtaining equal aggregate marks:**

While arriving rank list, when two or more candidates obtain equal aggregate marks for 100 based on the marks scored in the Higher Secondary Course or equivalent examination, the inter se merit / rank of such candidates shall be determined on the basis of the following factors in the succeeding order:

- Percentage of marks in Biology or Botany and Zoology taken together.
- Percentage of marks in Physics and Chemistry taken together.
- Percentage of marks obtained in all subjects.

- Date of Birth – Weightage will be given to Seniority in age.

13. **Counselling Procedure:**

13.1. The Selection will be made through Single Window counselling following the rule of reservation prescribed by the Government of Tamil Nadu detailed as follows:

13.2. Counselling will be held at the office of the Secretary, Selection Committee, Directorate of Indian Medicine & Homoeopathy, Arignar Anna Government Hospital of Indian Medicine Campus, Arumbakkam, Chennai – 600 106.

13.3. The counselling schedule will be uploaded in the official website – [www.tnhealth.tn.gov.in](http://www.tnhealth.tn.gov.in). Candidates shall attend the counselling session in person without fail on the scheduled date for their cut-off marks mentioned in the website.

13.4. At the time of counselling, Candidates can choose the Course and the School of their own choice available at the time of their merit.

- Note: 13.4.a Individual request for change of course or school and mutual transfer will not be entertained under any circumstances once allotment is issued for the Candidate.
- 13.5. Candidates those who get re-totaled / re-valued marks can also attend the counselling on the day and session according to their revised marks. In case, the session to which they are eligible as per their revised marks has already over, then their candidature will be considered in the ongoing session only.
- 13.6. All Candidates shall appear in person on the scheduled date and time of their counselling without fail. If any Candidates fails to appear in person at the time of counselling their candidature will not be considered for admission on later date. However, the Selection Committee reserves the right to permit the candidate to attend the counselling on a later date, but within the cut-off date, if a valid reason, to the satisfactory of the Selection Committee for absence is communicated to the Selection Committee before the commencement of the counselling. The candidates so permitted shall be eligible only to opt for the school or course where seats are available at the time of counselling when they actually attend. The candidates who fail to join the course allotted on the prescribed date and time will not be eligible for admission on a later date.
- 13.7. One parent will be allowed to attend the counselling along with the candidate and they have to make their own arrangements for attending the counselling session.
- 13.8. Website notification regarding the counselling schedule cannot be presumed as guaranteed admission since admission shall be restricted to the availability of seats.

- 13.9 The Selected Candidates will be called for verification of certificates by the Heads of the institutions concerned. Candidates should produce the original mark sheet of the qualifying examinations and other original documents, such as proof of age, community certificate, transfer certificate, certificate for proof of special category, Nativity Certificate etc., at the time of verification. Selection will be cancelled if the candidates do not produce all the original documents as required.
- 13.10 The movement of candidate from one Government school to another Government school will be based on the merit following the rule of reservation, subject to vacancy position. The date of such counselling will be published in the website.
- 13.11. All communications regarding the selection process for the Diploma Courses i.e., D.N.T. and D.I.P., should be addressed only to the Secretary, Selection Committee, Directorate of Indian Medicine and Homoeopathy, Arignar Anna Government Hospital of Indian Medicine Campus, Arumbakkam, Chennai – 600 106.
- 13.12. The Selection and admission of D.I.P. and D.N.T. courses are only provisional. The Selection and admission is liable to be cancelled at any time as and when the eligibility conditions are found to be defective or incorrect or there has been suppression or misrepresentation of fact or the candidate is found ineligible against the requirement mentioned in this prospectus. (Also read with Clause 2.b.)
- 13.13 Candidates selected for admission should execute 'Discipline Declaration Form' as in Annexure IV and failure to execute the declaration will result in cancellation of the Selection of the candidate.
- 13.14 The documents enclosed with the application will not be returned. Candidates are requested to enclose only the self-attested photo copies of the certificates as on checklist along with the application.
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- 13.14 Candidates seeking admission against special category seats should
- (a) submit necessary certificates obtained from appropriate authorities in the prescribed form and submit them along with the application (as in the Annexure affixed with the prospectus respectively)

**Note:** Candidate claiming reservation (in special category or in communal reservation or any other) should produce relevant documents as sought in the prospectus. If the candidate fails to enclose the relevant document mentioned herein, the candidate's application will be considered under General category only.

13.15. Candidate should affix his / her passport size photography taken within three months prior to submission of application and self-attested in the place provided in the application form.

13.16. All the entries in the application form should be written legibly by the candidate in his/her own handwriting. The candidate should ensure that all information including the marks in the qualifying examination furnished by him/her in the application and the enclosures are correct. The Candidate is informed that, if the marks furnished by him/her in the application are found not correct or any other information is found to be incorrect, in a later date, then:

- i. He / She has to forfeit the admission, no matter at whatever stage of the course he/she will be at that time.
- ii. He / She will be debarred from pursuing any studies for a period of three years.

Legal action / Criminal action will be initiated against him/her and also against his/her parent/guardian for furnishing incorrect information. (Also read with clauses 2.b. and 13.12.)

14. **Special Categories:**

14.1. Counselling for the Special Categories (Eminent Sports Person, Children of Ex-Servicemen and Persons with Bench Mark Disabilities) will be done ahead of the General Category. The Candidates have to appear in person along with the relevant original certificates at the venue specified

in the Website.

- 14.2. Seats earmarked for the Special Categories will be allotted following the horizontal reservation. If sufficient number of candidates are not available for allotment against any of the Special category seats, the vacant seats will be added to the General pool of seats and filled up with candidates from the merit list duly applying the rule of reservation.
- 14.3. Seats Reserved for Children of Ex-Servicemen:

Note:. 14.3.a The Candidates should furnish a certificate as prescribed in the format as in Annexure – II obtained from the competent authority.

Note:. 14.3.b The Special committee from the defence authorities constituted for this purpose will scrutinize certificates submitted by the candidates. Eligible candidates will be selected on merit basis. The other eligibility conditions for admission to D.N.T. course and D.I.P. course will be as applicable in case of General Category.

- 14.4. Seats reserved for Eminent Sports Person:

Note: 14.4.a Selection will be done by the common committee constituted for this purpose. The mode of selection will be made as per the guidelines prescribed by the competent authority.

- 14.5. Seats reserved for persons with disability

Note: 14.5.a 5% of the total number of seats available in Government Schools of Paramedical Courses are reserved for physically challenged candidates.

Note: 14.5.b The candidates seeking admission under this category should furnish a medical certificate as prescribed in Annexure III obtained from competent authority and also enclose full size photograph exhibiting the deformity along with the filled in application. The decision of Selection Committee is final on the eligibility of candidate seeking admission under the proviso of Rights of Person with Disability Act 2016.

Note: 14.5.c Both upper limbs, vision and hearing must be normal.

14.6. Candidates seeking admission against special category seats should submit necessary certificates obtained from appropriate authorities in the prescribed form annexed respectively and submit them along with the application.

Note: 14.6.a If the required certificates and documents for Special Category are not enclosed the candidate will not be considered under Special Category. In this case, by default, their candidature will be considered under General Category.

17. **Others:**

17.1. **Hepatitis – B – Vaccination:**

All candidates selected should take the Hepatitis – B – Vaccine before admission and produce a certificate as in Annexure – VI.

17.2 **Covid Protocol**

The candidates and their parents are instructed to follow the standard preventive measures of COVID during the counselling as per

Government Orders from time to time.

17.3. **Ragging:**

The candidates who join the Diploma courses should not indulge or participate in any kind of ragging throughout their study period. If they are found to have indulged in ragging at any time, the candidate will be removed from the roll of the Institution regardless of whatever stage of study they are in and criminal action will be taken against the candidate.

17.4. Candidates applied for the Diploma courses 2023 - 2024 session are deemed to have read the contents in the Prospectus and agreed with all the conditions / clauses and will not have the right to challenge any of the clauses contained in this Prospectus.

17.5 Students who have 80% of attendance only will be permitted to write Diploma examinations (DIP/DNT) on completion of each semester. However, they will be allowed to appear in supplementary examination. The candidates who have successfully completed the course and the Continuous internship training will be awarded with Diploma certificate.

17.6 Selection for the course is only provisional. The selection committee reserves the rights to cancel the selection and admission of the candidates at any time as and when eligibility conditions are found to be defective in addition to facts suppressed or overlooked.

17.7 Candidate selected for admission to DNT/D.I.P Courses are NOT guaranteed any appointment in Government Service.

17.8 Candidates selected for admission and their parent/guardian will have to sign discipline declaration form in Annexure – IV.

17.9 Candidates while pursuing the Diploma Course (DIP/DNT), have break the study and such break crossed double the duration of course for any reason such as marriage, maternity and on medical grounds **will not be allowed to continue the course**. Students who have not passed their Diploma examination and crossed double the duration of period of course of study are permitted to complete their semester examination within a period of 1 year + 1 year grace period totaling 2 years, failing which the

candidate will be discharged from the concerned courses of study.

- 17.10. The Government orders issued and to be issued from time to time pertaining to any of the matters contained in the Prospectus should be read as part and parcel of this Prospectus and such Terms and Conditions in the Government Orders are deemed to have been incorporated in this Prospectus.

1. This certificate should be issued by an officer of the Revenue Department not below the rank of Tahsildar of the Taluk concerned.
2. This Certificate **should not be issued** by the Special Tahsildars, Deputy Tahsildars such as Loans, Land Acquisition, Election, Excise HQs Deputy Tahsildars, Special Deputy Collectors, Assistance Commissioner of Agricultural Income, Excise, Elections etc.
3. Any foreign national irrespective of the period of study in the State will not become eligible to apply for this course. No certificate of Nativity in the State of Tamil Nadu should therefore be issued to Nationals of other countries for this purpose.
4. The certificate should bear the stamp of the office of the officer signing the certificate. The certifying officers should insist upon clear proof of the Nativity of the parent or guardian of the candidate and satisfy themselves on the genuineness of the residential qualification. They should be particularly careful in the case of candidates whose mothertongue is not Tamil and whose place of birth is other than Tamil Nadu.

5. Permanent Residence Certificate will not be considered as Nativity Certificate.
6. The guidelines prescribed for the issue of Nativity Certificate and they are as follow as per Lr. No. R.A.V (B) – 16932/2000, dated 3.4.2000 of the Special Commissioner and Commissioner of Revenue Administration, Chepauk, Chennai - 5.
- (a) The parents / guardians of the applicants / students or the applicant themselves should have permanently resided continuously for a period of 5 years in Tamil Nadu.
  - (b) Permanently residing for a period of 5 years should be supported by documentary evidence.
  - (c) The family ration card, Electoral Roll, census list if taken recently, documents like sale deed, tax receipt etc. relating to the property owned by either of the parents or by the applicant may be verified.
  - (d) The Transfer Certificate issued by the school authorities where the applicant had studied last may be verified to know whether he / she was in the state for 7 years.
  - (e) Enquiry in the village / place of residence of the neighbour / Village Administrative Officers regarding continuous residing.
  - (f) To ensure that wrong or incorrect address had not been furnished to obtain the certificate.
  - (g) The birth place of the parent, place of the residence of the parent / father, permanent assets, mother tongue, place of education, place of marriage of the applicant / parents, the period of stay in and outside Tamil Nadu can also be considered before issuing certificate.
